Responding to the Care Review and Reforms

At a fundamental level it keeps coming back to workforce and having a supported skilled workforce to do the task. Whatever outcomes are envisaged, there needs to be sufficient social workers to do the task, the network emphasises that this continues to rely on the promotion of the social work profession as a valued and valuable professional resource which requires further political and financial investment to support sustainable change with families and communities.
