- Self harm age 11
- Sexual abuse age 14
- Drug & Alcohol addiction age 14
- Domestic abuse relationships
- Single mum at 23
- Catastrophic birth complications





Christine – Family Support

- Saw me as a vulnerable young mum
- Heard my past and saw its impact
- Didn't judge or label
- Listened and acted
- Helped me form support network
- ▶ 8 months support
- Successful legal career



Life changed

- Lonely and stressed
- Overworked and struggling
- Mental Health problems
- Opiates overprescribed
- Met partner
- Control and coercion
- Addiction issues
- Turned to GP signposted to LA
- Asked for Christine
- No more Family Support Workers
- Son given Social Worker



Social Worker

- Judged and blamed
- Abusive childhood made me a risk to my child
- Opiate addiction my fault
- Abusive partner leave him told him I made allegations
- No access to support waiting lists
- Mental Health Breakdown Son into foster care \$20?
- Pregnant with second child partner left
- Space to make changes got clean
- Son returned home severe attachment issues
- Second son born catastrophic labour as focus on CSC not maternal needs
- Partner bullied way back in his house no choice



Beginning of the end

- Health needs ignored labelled using drugs
- Haemorrhaged 24 hours off septic shock
- Forced to go home care for children
- Viciously assaulted
- Children at risk Failure to Protect
- Signed contract keep him away
- No help couldn't stop him
- Begged for help "Get us out of there please!!"
- Children removed son from nursery causing trauma
- Tried to fight for them
- Told they were being adopted New Years Eve 2003
- Attempted suicide Feb 2004
- Goodbye 2nd July 2004
- Final words "I love you I promise mammy will write to you really soon"



Broken promises


- Abandoned by Local Authority
- No agreement for letterbox
- Desperate for help and support
- Solicitor referred me to After Adoption
- Supported & empowered
- Secured letterbox
- Encouraged to speak out, raise awareness
- Terrified of judgment and blame
- Met Bridget Lindley Family Rights Group
- Joined FRG. Found my tribe

Finding my voice

- Scared of judgment & blame
- Accepted & valued
- Lone voice in the beginning
- 2013 Care Enquiry voices of all together
- 2014 FRG panels comfort and support from each other
- 2016 Became Trustee use my voice to shape organisation
- Our voices matter we can turn negative experiences into positive messages for policy and practice



Being seen as an Expert

- 2020 Co-chaired Cafcass L&I Board
- 2021 Took over as Chair Family Rights Group – 50% Board has lived experience
- 2022 Joined Family Justice Council
- 2022 EbyE Board Care Review
- 2023 National Implementation Board
- 2023 Awarded MBE for services to children and families
- Work with Local Authorities setting up panels and forums
- Born into Care study & HOPE mum
- Speak nationally and internationally about the importance of lived experience in service design and implementation
- Reunited with son in 2020 battle on his side this time!



FOUR KEY QUESTIONS

WHY

- Because it's the right thing to do
- Partnership legislation
- Work with not do to!
- Complaint route only way to feedback where's the good stuff?

WHO

- Senior Management Buy In
- Who will support?
- Who could join?
- Who shouldn't join?

HOW

- Make collecting feedback routine
- Ask families how they feel
- Give them a voice
- Acknowledge and minimise trauma
- Be realistic
- Feedback the actions

WHEN

Only when you understand WHY, HOW and WHO can you answer WHEN?
